DROP OFF AND PICK UP CONCERNS

*Have your child ready to get out of the car, coat on and seat belt off, last hugs and kisses given. This keeps the line moving smoothly. Also, in cold weather, this helps our volunteers and staff from freezing! Starting October, you may walk your child in to school if you prefer.

*Please have your child's car seat situated on the passenger side of the car. This keeps children safer. We do not want children walking between cars.

*Siblings should not be left in cars while parents walk in to drop off older children.

*At pick up time, please pull ahead **out of the carpool lane** to buckle your child into their car seat. This will help to keep the line moving quickly and smoothly.

*Thank you for helping us keep drop off and pick up times safe and efficient, it is much appreciated.

PLAYGROUND

We will be going outside every day possible. Be sure to send your child in play clothes, appropriate shoes, and warm jackets and accessories when needed!

Please be sure to label any notes with your child's name, teacher, and the session that they attend. Clothing, jackets, hats, backpacks, etc., should also be labeled with your child's name as this will help alleviate any confusion. Thank you!

SICK CHILD POLICY

Please inform the school if your child will not be present. Parents must notify CDLC within 24 hours when a child has contracted a contagious disease.

If your child cannot participate in daily activities, including outdoor play, due to the following symptoms, they must be kept home:

- ◆ Unexplained lethargy
- ◆ Vomiting within the last 24 hours
- ◆ Fever
- ◆ Drainage from eyes/ears
- ◆ Lice and ringworm (must be treated before a child may return)
- ◆ Bacterial infection before 24 hours of antibiotic treatment
- ◆ Diarrhea within 24 hours
- ◆ Undiagnosed rash
- ◆ Significant respiratory distress
- ◆ Chicken pox (unless lesions are healed)
- ◆ Requires more care than staff can provide without compromising health and safety of other children

The symptoms listed have been established by the Department of Human Services with concern for the health and welfare of all children. Please help us keep illness to a minimum by being aware of these symptoms and keeping your child home if they come down with any of them.

If the symptoms occur while at school, parents will be contacted to pick up their child from school. We have a cot and an area where the child may rest until their parent or other authorized person is able to pick them up.

SCHOOL CLOSINGS

If the weather is not safe for travel CDLC will close school. Closures will be announced on KSTP Channel 5 TV. You will also receive an email announcing the school closing.
